



MUSÉE DE L'ARMÉE - INVALIDES



Located in the heart of the Hôtel National des Invalides, the Musée de l'Armée invites visitors to explore he history of France across some 15,000 m², from the angle of military life and war. A museum of history, fine arts and science and technology all in one, the institution was created in 1905 and conserves one of the world's finest military history collections, containing almost 500,000 items (uniforms, weapons, armour, drawings, paintings, photographs, etc.) from the Bronze Age to the 21st century. It also invites the public to discover the famous Les Invalides Dôme, which houses Napoleon I's tomb. With some 1.2 million visitors a year, the Musée de l'Armée is one of Paris' most popular museums.

Fundamentally human, history made incarnate, sometimes glorified and often harrowing, these days military history is considered in terms of its political, social, cultural, geographic and economic realities, opening up new avenues for reflection. With this very much in mind, the Musée de l'Armée has undertaken a large-scale extension and transformation programme: by 2030, the MINERVE project will have led to the opening of 4 new permanent tours: "The Hôtel des Invalides, between history and memories"; "France's armed forces and military engagements"; "Colonisation, decolonisation, a shared history"; "After 1945: from the Cold War to the present day". Through the project, the Museum aims to become France's museum of world history from the angle of military life and war, taking a resilient, comprehensive approach, paying close attention to our country's interactions with the world and giving otherness its rightful place and voice. True to its civic vocation, the Musée de l'Armée asserts its determination to provide all sectors of the public with the keys to understanding the state of the world and its evolution, making the connection between past, present and future.

DUELSTHE ART OF FIGHTING

David against Goliath, Athos against d'Artagnan, Chirac against Mitterrand, Federer against Nadal and Harry Potter against Voldemort, etc. from ancient Egyptian times to the present day, from East to West, men have fought in duels throughout history and in fiction: so to resolve a dispute, seek redress or simply for the sake of their honour, two adversaries met in single combat, staged according to very precise rules. A duel is a form of scheduled, ritualised, even choreographed and legitimised violence: it complies with a protocol which, depending upon the era and the country, has been more or less authorised.

Practiced, tolerated or condemned, but always appreciated, the duel is a genuine social phenomenon which has crossed borders and travelled down the ages. Ferocious, flamboyant, serious or spectacular, this mode of confrontation is ever present, in various forms, in the world of politics, sport, art and video games. Through the *Duels. The Art of Fighting* exhibition, the Musée de l'Armée returns to the duel's historical sources to explore its main principles and developments, including the fantasies of our collective imagination.

Staged to coincide with the Paris 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games, notably whilst fencing events are taking place at the Grand Palais, the *Duels. The Art of Fighting* exhibition allows the origins of this Olympic discipline to be retraced: although duellists no longer fight each other to the death, they observe rules based on various forms of duels that the Musée de l'Armée is keen to analyse. Swords, rapiers, pistols, sabres, navaja blades, daggers and even tennis racquets are on display, **in a theatrical setting that plunges visitors into the world of the duel.**

The duel's greatest historical figures are portrayed throughout the itinerary: Mademoiselle de Maupin piercing the Duke de Luynes's shoulder with her sword before taking him as a lover; the Samourais Musashi and Kojirō fight on the island of Ganryu; the knight Jean de Carrouges confronting Jacques le Gris in 1386, in what is considered to be the last trial by combat; and also the Baron de Jarnac and François de Vivonne, Lord of La Châtaigneraie, fighting a duel in front of King Henry II and the court at Saint-Germain-en-Laye castle in 1547. The protagonists of colourful stories that illustrate how, over the centuries, reality and fiction (novels, films, etc.) have influenced each other and helped to root the "spectacle" of the duel within popular culture and the collective imagination.

A range of cultural activities will be scheduled around the exhibition: concerts, conferences, film screenings, guided tours, and activities for younger visitors.

THE HÔTEL DES INVALIDES BETWEEN HISTORY AND MEMORIES

New permanent itinerary Salle Vauban and Valenciennes Corridor

OPENING IN JUNE 2024

This spring, the Musée de l'Armée will be inaugurating a new 400-metre permanent tour² devoted to the history of the Hôtel national des Invalides. Retracing the life of the monument founded in 1674 by Louis XIV for his wounded or elderly soldiers, the tour enables visitors to gain a greater understanding of the links between the Musée de l'Armée and the Invalides. Composed of four spaces (an exhibition room, an immersive room, a rolling display space and a "Main Guest" section), the "Hôtel des Invalides: between history and memories" itinerary is the first stage of the major extension and transformation project, MINERVE (MINERVA).

An itinerary that retraces the history of the Invalides

A major witness to French history and a regalian site since its foundation in 1674, the Hôtel des Invalides evolved along with the prevailing political regimes: initially a hospital under the Ancien Régime, then a military pantheon under the Empire and finally a heritage site under the Republic. The itinerary "L'Hôtel des Invalides: between history and memories" aims to illustrate this through 26 unique items that document and embody three centuries of history.

Four spaces and four insights into the Musée de l'Armée

Directly accessible from the new Museum reception areas in the refurbished East Lobby, the "Hôtel des Invalides: between history and memories" itinerary is being developed on the ground floor. According to a creative setting designed by the Helft&Pinta workshop, the tour begins in the Salle Vauban, the former refectory for residents of the sumptuously- decorated Invalides.

Three other spaces located in the Valenciennes Corridor are then proposed:

- an immersive room, offering visitors a new way to experience the building, designed to provide genuine entertainment with a strong aesthetic and sensory dimension;
- a rolling display space, devoted to the Musée de l'Armée's current programme, offering theme-based suggestions for exploring the collections. To coincide with the Paris 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games, its initial editorialisation (June 2024 May 2025) will address the issue of the links between sport and the military world;
- finally the last space, entitled "Main Guest", offers a prominent figure from the world of the military, arts, sciences, sports or politics the opportunity to become involved in the Museum and speak through one or two items selected from the collections

Improve the welcome extended to visitors during the 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games

The steady increase in the Museum's attendance rates (almost 1.2 million visitors in 2023) required a review of the arrangements for welcoming the public in order to improve flow management and guarantee an improved visitor experience. This has now been achieved, with the redevelopment of the entrance hall and the relocation of the ticket office, just as the Invalides – located next to the Esplanade, an Olympic and Paralympic venue that shares its name – is preparing to receive ever-increasing numbers of visitors.



EDITORIALISATION OF THE COLLECTIONS

7 NOVEMBER 2023 – 21 APRIL 2024 Perpignan Corridor – West Wing

This post-war photographer's career followed in the footsteps of a generation of "reporter-illustrators" who were stimulated by a flourishing press and dynamic commissions from State agencies. Restricting itself to the 1958-1970 period, the exhibition presents a range of outstanding prints and previously unseen contact sheets, illustrating the career of a genuinely talented photographer, hailed in his lifetime by the entire profession of which he became an advocate. Léon Herschtritt focused on news sidelines and particularly at the way in which History disrupts the course of individual lives. In an official capacity, he covered the tumultuous weeks of May and June 1958 in Algeria. In August 1961 he decided to go to Berlin, having learnt that a wall was being erected there. He captured fleeting moments between individuals, combining hope and sorrow, such as this photograph of a couple standing on the roof of their car, waving to relatives who remained on the other side. Herschtritt also photographed many prominent figures. Amongst his famous subjects, special reference may be made to the figure of General de Gaulle.

Soldiers and champions

JUNE 2024 – MAY 2025 Valenciennes Corridor – East Wing

Although it had always been one of High Command's preoccupations, training soldiers for battle became institutionalised from 1852, with the creation of the École nationale militaire de gymnastique (National Military Gymnastics School) in Joinville, the source of the famous "Joinville Batallion", and the present-day Centre national des sports de la Défense (National Defence Sports Centre, CNSD). The inclusion of sports within the armed forces meets three objectives: physical training for soldiers, reconstruction through the reintegration of wounded soldiers, and the nation's visibility through high-level sport. Within the context of the Paris 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games, through its collections and loans from various champions, the Musée de l'Armée is analysing the profound ties that unite the armed forces and the field of sports, each drawing upon the other in order to enhance their performance.

3 JULY - 13 OCTOBER 2024 Historial Charles de Gaulle - East Wing

Presented within the context of the Paris 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games, this editorialisation showcases the sports and cultural policy initiated by De Gaulle. France suffered humiliation at the 1960 Olympic Games in Rome; it didn't win a single Olympic medal. The French government then embarked upon a major reform of its sports and Olympic movement. Eight years later, in Grenoble, France took 3rd place behind Norway and the USSR.

Meanwhile, a comprehensive cultural policy was initiated. The visual artist Jean Dewasne (1921 – 1999) created the large-scale décor at Grenoble's ice stadium. This editorialisation presents a series of ten preparatory gouaches produced in 1967, as well as records, which serve as a reminder of the 5th Republic's sports and cultural policy and its key territorial development projects.

The Forgotten Battles of the Free French Forces: the Liberation of the Vosges and Alsace, Autumn 1944

6 NOVEMBER 2024 – 30 MARCH 2025 Historial Charles de Gaulle – East Wing

Although the Free French Forces' involvement came to an end on 31 July 1943, thus marking the desire to establish a France that was united in combat, various fates were reserved for the Free French. General Leclerc, Commander of the 2nd DB (Armoured Division), managed to unite his fighters irrespective of their origins: Free French, African Army soldiers, French escapees, etc. and liberated Paris. The 1st DFL (Free French Division), rechristened DMI (Infantry Marching Division), was involved in the fighting in Italy then during the Provence Landings.

After ending up in Nod-sur-Seine, in the département of the Côte d'Or, the fighters who had landed in Normandy and Provence marched towards the Vosges and Alsace – where the German army had retreated and reorganised itself – to fight in particularly hard battles during a harsh winter. They liberated Strasbourg on 23 November 1944 and Colmar on 2 February 1945.




European Heritage Days

THE INVALIDES MUSICAL SEASON



Every year, the Invalides Musical Season creates a buzz within the prestigious Invalides building, the history of which is profoundly linked to music: it has hosted religious and military celebrations since its foundation by Louis XIV in 1670.

Throughout the year, its Musical Season offers the public concert cycles related to commemorative events and the Museum's temporary exhibitions.


In response to the 350th anniversary of the Invalides' welcoming of its first pensioners, veterans and soldiers wounded during Louis XIV's military campaigns, Hugo Reyne and students from the Paris Conservatory's Department of Early Music are performing a programme of baroque music from the 17th and 18th centuries, followed by a narration of the history of the Invalides by Denis Podalydès, accompanied by Olivier Beaumont, Julien Chauvin, and soloists from the *Concert de la Loge*.

In spring 2024, in response to the *Duels. The Art of Fighting* exhibition, the Symphony Orchestras of the Republican Guard, Air and Space Music and Paris Sciences et Lettres, and also the *Loco Cello* and *I Gemelli* ensembles, accompanied by the soloists Mūza Rubackytè, Paul Meyer, François Salque, Marina Chiche, Pierre Génisson, the Berthollet sisters, Frank Braley, and Marie Perbost, will compete in astonishing duels. 17 concerts to revive the rivalries between the great composers Liszt, Mozart, the Chevalier de Saint-George, Tchaikovsky and Brahms.

The Invalides Musical Season's concerts are held in the Saint-Louis des Invalides cathedral and in the Grand Salon.
